Oct. 17, 2023. Forwarded email from Shelley Keimach: information about the Chi Weekend of Scholarship which is October 19-22. This was weekend programs honoring Rabbi Meszler's 18th year at Temple Sinai.

Oct. 13, 2023. The Sharon DEIC posted upcoming DEI observances and Events from October through December. See the DEIC website.

Oct. 12, 2023. Email from Toben Asklar: Letting people know that there is a Sharon Community Rally to stand with Israel. Oct. 11th at 5:15 at the Veterans Memorial Park Beach Bandstand sponsored by Temple Israel Temple Sinai, and Young Israel.

October 9th, 2023. Email forwarded from the Superintendent of the Sharon Public Schools: Letter of support to members of the community following the horrific attacks in Israel. The essence of his statement was to offer support and friendship to members of our community impacted by what is going on in Israel, and for us to continue to pull together with kindness,

support and sensitivity to those impacted, and to demonstrate to our children what embracing our fellow citizens of Sharon and the world is all about.

Oct. 6, 2023. Letter from the DEIC written by Toben Asklar: Support statement Regarding Valuing the Diversity of the Students in Sharon. Toben thanked people for opening the community forum and reading the SPS Nondiscrimination Policy. This policy sets norms for our community discourse and helps to create mutual understanding and a safer atmosphere for civilized communication. The letter was written in response to the LGBTQ+ vitriol, alarmism, misinformation and hateful tone of several public comments made in past meetings.

Oct. 6, 2023. Rev. Jolie, from the UU church was looking for someone to be the Zoom host at Monday's Darius Coombs event.

October 4, 2023. Toben's email asking people to edit some mistakes in a first flyer inviting people to participate in the Indigenous People's Day event at the UU Church. Darius Coombs from the Mashpee Wampanoag Tribe was coming to be part of the Town Proclamation by the Sharon Select Board at the town Offices at 10:30 a.m.

Oct. 3, 2023. Email from Toben thanking everyone for making Sharon Day such a success: both Fun and Educational. Shout out to Shelley and Alison for getting and making some great swag.

Sept. 30, 2023. Email from Toben: Toben was happy to report that SREA was partnering with the DEIC for the Indigenous People's Day events.

Sept 28, 2023. Toben sent out a draft letter to the school committee in regards to the anti-LGBTQ+ rhetoric during School Committee Open Forum.

Sept. 27, 2023. Email sent from Shelley Keimach urging people to sign up for Sharon Day open slots.

3. 7:10 p.m. Approval of minutes from 10/12/2023, DEIC meeting

Shelley Keimach motioned and Chandu Krishnan seconded that the minutes of October 12, 2023 be approved. The minutes were unanimously approved.

4. 7:14 p.m. DEI training modules for Town Committees status and launch date

Toben spoke to Melissa Imbaro who said that the contract with SunShower Learning is in progress, and should be done soon. Toben hopes that the DEIC will be among the first to take the training.

5. 7:20 p.m. Sharon's newest residents: Update by Shelley Keimach

Shelley reported that there are 13 families from Haiti and one family from Venezuela at the Econo Lodge. The state provides lunch and dinner each day. The state will provide transportation for legal and medical appointments. Shelley is working with people from Stoughton to provide English as a second language. The Chinese Church in Sharon may be the location. Financial Donations can be given through the Public Safety Building. Meg Dusseault and Lisa Eloi are excellent leaders.

Kim Hokanson mentioned that people need to work through the Thursday group rather than individually approach people at the Econo Lodge.

Subgroups are being formed around: fundraising, physical and mental health, and language.

CP Potosky has done translating in Spanish at the high school for one of the students.

6. 7:35 p.m. Support for community members amid rising antisemitism and Islamophobia in the U.S.

Toben shared statements about the increase of antisemitism and Islamophobia. Jews make up 2.4% of the US population and 60 % of faith-based hate crimes are toward Jews. The anti-defamation league has noted a 400% increase in anti-Semitic incidents since October 7, 2023. An NBC report noted a rise of 182% jump of anti-Muslim activities in the 15-day period October 7-22, 2023. Toben asked if there are any ideas or actions to support Jewish and Muslim neighbors. Margie said that there are people who want the DEIC to speak to this issue. Chandu Krishnan suggested that we might want to be a voice for peace and moderation, expressing empathy. You can make statements every day, so there is a virtue in being selective. It is not the role of the committee to take sides. Toben mentioned that it is not a policy of the town to make political statements about global issues. Alison clarified that Toben's statement about anti-LGBTQ rhetoric was about what was happening in Sharon. Bill suggested that if we were to write statement saying that we share the pain of people affected by violence that we send those statements to specific religious communities (to Sharon Temples and to Sharon Mosques) and not simply post a statement of website. He emphasized building individual relationships with those from whom we are different. Bill stated that he was very glad that many members of DEIC were involved with the new residents, which is "in our lane," and making a difference. The committee discussed possible responses on many levels. Alison mentioned the danger of virtue signaling around statements. The chair took a comment from a community member who expressed disappointment that DEIC was not making a statement about antisemitism.

7. 8:19 p.m. Discussion of possible Stoughton/Sharon Martin Luther King holiday celebration Bettye Sabree, co-chair of Stoughton Equal Opportunity Committee, talked about Sharon partnering with Stoughton or attending Stoughton events for Rev. Martin Luther King, Jr. Weekend. We will begin with a tour by the historical committee on January 11th (6:00 – 8:00 PM and 13th (2:00-4:00 PM).

January 15 there will be a free Martin Luther King Day celebration from 10 am to 4 pm January 15 at the new Stoughton Library (<https://www.eventbrite.com/e/rev-dr-martin-luther-king-jr-annual-celebration-pursuing-your-purpose-tickets-750458320037>). This will include speakers, vendors, performers, activities for children. There will also be a food pantry drive handled by the Y.

Theme: Pursuing Your Purpose. The main speaker will be talking about mental health and behavioral health needs. There will be teen dancing from the Dance Connection. There will be health care providers.





